

SERVICE DAY REMINDERS

- Have all materials set out at the curb by 6:30 a.m.
- Set out recycle cart and glass bin when they are nearly full.



SPECIAL CURBSIDE WASTE



BATTERIES

Tape ends of batteries then place in a sealed, clear plastic bag on top of the cart



MOTOR OIL & ANTIFREEZE

Set out in a clear, one-gallon plastic jug with a screw-top lid next to the recycle cart

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE

Household hazardous waste (HHW), cannot be placed in the garbage or recycling. Dispose of these items for free at one of the transfer stations during the following days:
